Featured Speakers



Lloyd Carr was among the winningest active football coaches in the NCAA Division I Football. His teams won five Big Ten titles and the 1997 national championship. He became the first Wolverine coach to win four straight bowl games: the 2001 Florida Citrus Bowl, the 1998 Rose Bowl, 1999 Florida Citrus Bowl, and the 2000 Orange Bowl.

In addition to his work on the football field, Carr is involved with the University and the community. He has been active in support of women's athletics, endowing a women's sports scholarship at U of M. Since 2004, an annual summer "Carr's Wash for Kids" has been held with the proceeds benefiting C.S. Mott Children's Hospital. Carr also hosts the Hall-of-Fame Football Camp in his hometown of Riverview, MI.

His integrity is widely lauded as one of his defining characteristics, and a major part of his legacy.

In her young career, **Carolyn Kahl** is already earning acclaim from perceptive journalists, hailing the "...gifted and mature young artist she is," says the Seattle Times.

Carrie grew up in Saginaw and earned her Bachelor of Music degree in vocal performance from the University of Michigan. Many Rotarians in the District have enjoyed hearing the lovely and talented Carrie sing.

Having just returned from Germany—as a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar—Carrie will tell of her six months studying voice and opera in Germany. Maybe she'll even share a song or two!



Lt. Governor John D. Cherry, Jr. is a seasoned leader with more than 20 years of service in the Michigan Legislature as a State Representative, State Senator and Minority Leader. Cherry has received many awards and honors, including recognition from The Detroit News as one of Michigan's most effective legislators. Cherry was named the 2005 *Conservationist of the Year* by the Michigan United Conservation Clubs (MUCC) and is the immediate past chair of the Great Lakes Commission. He also has served as Chair of the National Lieutenant Governor's Association.

Born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, **Ray Scott** is a retired NBA professional basketball player and coach. A 6'9" forward/center who played college hoops at the University of Portland, Scott was the 4th pick in the 1961 NBA Draft, selected by the Detroit Pistons. Scott had an 11 year career in the NBA and the ABA with the Pistons, the Baltimore Bullets, and the Virginia Squires.

Scott went on to coach the Pistons from 1972 through 1976. In 1974 he won the Red Auerbach Trophy, now better known as the NBA Coach of the Year Award. Ray was elected to the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame in 2008.

Now based in the metro Detroit area and the Development Director for Lutheran Child and Family Services, Ray's easy manner and important message make him a speaker you'll not want to miss!
